#### How we involve schools

With permission, your child's school will be contacted on admission. A lead teacher will liaise with your child's home school and named clinicians to insure that needs are met by setting targets for education.

Daily plans and target setting are sent to your child's school before external reviews so that your home school will know how your child has progressed.

When your child is discharged from hospital your child's school will be emailed a detailed teaching record informing them all about the work that your child has completed during their stay.

> Each term an evaluation report of work already taught will be shared with the pupil

#### Who We Are ?

The hospital education service (HES) provides education for young people during their stay in Stobhill Hospital . (HES) staff are fully qualified teachers .

## Who do we teach?

Pupils who are currently enrolled in full time education (S1-S6).

Pupils who are attending Skye House as an inpatient.

If you are worried about falling behind in school don't worry because the teachers will contact your own school and will find out what work to cover with you. .What time does school start and finish?

Starts at 9am and finishes at 3pm.

How long is each lesson?

Half an hour.

Is there a school nurse?

Yes we have school nurse who anybody can go to at any time if they need a chat.

### Is there a pupil council?

Yes, it is held once a month for pupils to express their views and put ideas across that they may have.

Are there school holidays?

Yes the school holidays are the Glasgow holidays.

What subjects do we teach?

Variety of subjects.

What activities/clubs are available?

Baking, horse ridding, swimming, gardening, art therapy.

### How do we teach?

We use a variety of teaching approaches and a wide range of resources to motivate and stimulate pupils.

Information and communications technology is used , where possible , across the curriculum.

By liaising with pupils own base schools we endeavour to ensure continuity of learning. Pupils who will be in hospital for 6 weeks or more will have targets set for their learning. This is done in co-operation with the pupil and their home school.
